Most people are well meaning in their attempt to save us (especially from ourselves, as they would perceive it). Waith has periodically spoken of Spiritual Elitists, those who think they have all the *right* answers ~ the right way to meditate, the right clothes to wear, the right way to eat, think, behave. Consider his words:

And, when you do not need externals, these externals lose the power they have, and therefore, their status quo is shaken, lost, or threatened ~ and they, then, would want to maintain their power by telling you what to do."

I believe that we will have people who come to us and feel that we need to be saved ~ we do not believe as they do, theirs is the only truth, and therefore, if we do not believe as they do, we are damned. It is a most difficult lesson. It is a test for each of us to develop our own strength and develop the faith that we must have in the connectedness of us, as entities, with The Universal Consciousness.
