What Have I Learned?



Mushiba: "If I don't make the right decision, I won't learn the lesson I'm supposed to learn," is a common statement I hear. Many people perceive that there is **one right** or **one wrong** way to *Learn My Lesson*. During his discussion on the topic, *Call to Be of Service*, Waith counseled:

Waith: "Whatever you choose is the right decision ~ and, while it may not create the end result that you, at concrete, had hoped for, it was the right decision. Step back from it and say, 'What was learned here?""

There are infinite choices in decision making and each option is, ultimately, the correct one ~ and reflects the free will that we each have. If we perceive that a choice we made was not the correct one, it may be difficult to view that decision as the right one. However, if we can step aside and determine what we learned, then it truly was a correct choice. If we are not able to see, at concrete, what was learned, that, in itself, is a lesson ~ a lesson in Trust.
