## Our Soul Memories Are Like A Computer



Mushiba: Like many people, I store information from my computer in The Cloud. And when needed, I can go to The Cloud to access that stored information and download it to my computer, use it and then upload any changes I made to that file to The Cloud.

During a Public Session in 1994, Waith used the analogy of a computer to discuss our Soul memories:

Waith: "You each have incredible Soul memories. You cannot possibly have access, simultaneously, to all of that information. It is selective and protective. You protect Self from being overwhelmed by information that is not necessary, yet you know that it is there for accessing ~ much like your computers. It has many programs that are stored and ready when needed ~ and you can store it all on a disk.

"Well, this is the equivalent to your Soul memories ~ you can access it, take it out, place it back and it is stored away as you need it. You each have the power to access your own memories ~ from your other lifetimes ~ and it is simply whether or not you have the desire to do so."

I chuckled when I read this excerpt because of Waith's use of the term, disk. Remember that this was 1994 and flash drives had not been brought into our awareness, let alone The Cloud. During the last twenty-five years since that Public Session, we have learned much, including a new way to access the files on our computers. The same is true for accessing our Soul memories. As we grow and learn our lessons, we have more knowledge about Self, which eventually enables us to better access our Soul memories.
