Mushiba: During his discussion about *Organized Religion*, Waith was asked about the power of meditating in particular buildings ~ and his answer, not unexpectedly, led to judgements about religion and heaven:

Question: There are some magnificent buildings, such as the Sistine Chapel, that are built with geometric alignments and are power spots. Does spending time in such a building have any effect ~ or, would one better sit at home meditating and ‘*tuning*’ into that kind of structure?

Waith: *“It goes back to where you are in your particular evolvment. For some entities, that type of environment is important to their growth, and for others it would now be disharmonious to their energies. So, you must be careful of the judgements. Your question has a judgement in it that, well, this is perhaps not a very good environment any more. Perhaps for some entities it is not, and that is not a negative if it is a harmonious environment for another. And thus, look at each energy grouping as harmonious for someone. It may not be for you.*

“And thus it is with religion that the dividing lines are drawn. If you belong to one religion, then you are able to go to heaven! And if you do not belong to that religion, then you do not go to heaven ~ wherever that is. We have not found it yet.

“Supposedly, we (The Angelics) inhabit heaven ~ I am not quite sure where it is. Heaven is in your own hearts. Heaven is the love that you hold for Self. It is not dictated by a religion, as a spot up in the sky.”

One of my favorite quotes from Waith is the one about Heaven. Many people believe in something that, to them, symbolizes heaven ~ to name a few: Paradise, Nirvana, Shangri-La, Harmony, any place of complete bliss, delight and peace. And, of course, clouds and angels! I like Waith’s symbol.
